INTRODUCTION OF SEMESTER SYSTEM :

The three years degree (TDC) Course for Arts and Commerce will be imparted as per Gauhati University Regulation of Semester System from the Academic Session 2011-2012.

(1) The Scheduled for the First Semester of the Courses (Arts and Commerce) are given below :

(a) First Semester (Including Examinaion)

From 16th July to December 31, 2011

(b) Second Semester (Including Examination)



From January, 1 to June 30, 2012

2. Evaluation Process :

Under the Semester System, there will be processes as given below :

- (a) Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks
- (b) External Evaluation : 80% Marks

* Internal Evaluation will be based on two sessional examinations – (i) Home assignments, (ii) Seminars, (iii) Library works, etc.

* External Evaluation will be through a final examination at the end of the semester.

* In the processes of semester, the pass marks in each theory paper is 30 percent and that in each practical paper is 40 per cent.

* In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the Internal as well as External evaluations separately.

* A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows :

- (a) First semester with the regular third semester examination.
- (b) Second semester with the regular fourth semester examination.
- (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth semester examination.
- (d) Fourth semester with the regular Sixth semester examination.

* A student may be allowed to 'Repeat' any one of the theory papers in the first, Second, Third and Fourth Semester and may be allowed for 'betterment' of marks in one paper in the fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that paper.



* No 'Repeat' or 'Betterment' shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any Semester.

* A student must pass all his Semester examination, including 'Repeat' and 'Betterment' chances within five years from the date of admission to the first semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.

* Since the Semester involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.

* Academic Calendar and Schedule for Semester System :

(a) Admission : Before 15th of June 2011

(b) (i) First semester classes : Starts from 16th July 2011

(ii) Sessional Examinations - I : September 2011

(iii) Sessional Examination - II : November 2011

(iv) Final Semester Examination : December

INCENTIVES, FACILITIES AND WELFARE ACTIVITIES

4.1. **Incentives for meritorious and needy students:** Packages of incentives for meritorious as well as needy students have been offered by the college authority since a couple of years. Five meritorious students will be selected on the basis of the conditions laid down by the authority. Selection will be from those students who have secured more than 60 percent mark.

4.2. **Facilities available :**

(a) **Games and Sports :** Football playground, Volleyball ground, Badminton court, Cricket ground, Archery field practice ground.

A Mini Stadium is in the College Campus.

Indoor Games Facilities : Badminton, Chess, Carrom, Arm Wrestling, Weight Lifting.

(b) **Art and Culture :** The college provides facilities to the students who are interested in art and culture by arranging cultural programmes, get together, festival and college week. Besides, college also provides scope to participate in extra curricular activities, competitions, youth festivals organised by G.U. and also other socio-cultural organizations.

4.3. **Library :**

The College library has a separate building placed in a calm and quiet environment with moderately high collection of text books, reference books of all subjects along with journals and newspapers for regular use of the teachers and students.

The library has well furnished reading room equipped with reading stand for students. The students are allowed to go through books, journals, news papers, bulletins in the reading room during the college hour. Readers are issued books temporarily for the day only.

Every student will be issued a library card against which two books for General course students and three books for Major course students will be issued for a specific time. The borrower of the book will be responsible for any damage or loss of the book. Students are also issued books under 'Book Bank' Scheme. Besides, reading facilities especially for competitive Examination books is also available in the library. The college library is equipped with computer for smooth management and systematic functioning. A cell on 'Gandhian Study' has also



been, started in the library. Apart from these, a distinctive cell on local publication is also coming up.

Departmental Library :

Besides all departments have departmental libraries linking with the central college library.

4.4. Hostel for Girls' and Boys'

The college has hostel accommodation for both girls' and boys'. Hostel seats for students will be allotted on requirements and merit basis.

A spacious Girls' (Women) Hostel (Single storied) has 70 Seats Capacity.

Boys' Hostel has 15 Seats capacity.

4.5. N.S.S. :

The College has a unit of National Service Scheme (N.S.S.). Community development programmes and services are rendered by this unit. COLLEGE RULES AND MANAGEMENT

5. 1 General Rules and Information

1. No Student shall be admitted in any course of studies as mentioned in Stream and admission process if he / she is found to have indulged in activities detrimental to academic interest.
 2. A Student who is found to violate College rules shall be liable to expulsion.
 3. Those Students admitted to various courses of studies are compulsory to participate in lectures, tutorial classes, remedial classes and other academic activities. Besides, they are required to participate in the co-curricular and extra curricular activities organised by departments and by constituent agencies of the institution.
 4. Students must appear at the examinations conducted by the academic bodies, such as class test, unit test, Pre-final test and Final Examinations.
 5. A student who is found to have indulged in consumption of intoxicating drinks and other elements and immoral activities shall be liable to expulsion.
 6. The students shall have to obey the regulations of the course they undertake, Rules and orders as may be prescribed by college, AHSEC and by the Gauhati University authorities.
 7. Any Student indulging to regging, involved in any such act is liable to expulsion from the college.
 8. Decision of Governing body and Disciplinary committee in all matters relating to students indiscipline shall be final and binding.
- 5.2. College hours : College starts from 9.15 a.m. and continues up to 4.15 p.m.
- 5.3. Discipline Maintenance : Every students should come to the college with his Identity Card with proper academic decorum.
- ☞ Students must present in the class regularly. Students attending less than 75% of the lectures delivered each subjects are not eligible to appear in the University/ Council Examination.
 - ☞ Students should keep the college premise clean and use the college property



with proper care and for any fault in the electrical material, they should inform the authority instead of trying to make it correct by themselves.

☞ In the library, they should maintain complete silence and should handle the books etc. very carefully. Entry of motorcycles, scooters and other vehicles are strictly prohibited into the college campus during college hours. There is also a vehicle parking site.

☞ Students should keep their bicycles in the cycle stand. Loitering in the veranda during the class-hour should be avoided. Dustbins marked as 'Use me' are placed in every nook and corner of the buildings for waste materials disposal.
