#### BACKGROUND OF THE COLLEGE

Bikali College is the seat of higher learning in the easternmost border of Goalpara district. The College was established on 14th April, 1982. It is the outcome of selfless dedicated service of the rural masses of fifty two villages, which constitute "Bikali Mouza Unnayan Samiti"- a socio-cultural Non-Governmental organization.

#### 1.1 Nomenclature of the College:

The College is named after 'Bikali 'Mouza' or 'Dihi', which is a part of the historical 'Habraghat Pargana'.

#### 1.2 Location:

The College is located at Dhupdhara, a small market township of Bikali Mouza area. It is 0.75 Km. away from N.H.37 and Dhupdhara Railway Station.

The College is under Rangjuli Tribal Development Block, Rangjuli revenue circle and 36-Dudhnoi ST Reserved L.A.C. (constituency) in Goalpara district of Assam.

### 1.3 College Campus:

The college has a spacious campus. The campus extends and sprawls out in consonance with the rural environment. Most of the buildings have been modelled and costructed keeping in view the future landscape and also to harmonise well with the rural setting in the sylvan grandeur. At present the college built-up area is more than 2.5 hectares out of 7 hectares of total land area. Of this 4.5 hectares is covered by playground, plantation schemes and agricultural garden.

#### 1.4 Stream:

It is an Arts and Commerce stream institution with major course in almost all the subjects. Besides, Major courses in Accountancy, Management and Finance have also been introduced in the Commerce stream. Career oriented programmes have also been introduced.

# 2.6. Syllabus for M.A. Semester Programme in Assamese General Introduction

- 1. (a) The Master of Arts (M.A.) Programme (Previously called 'Course') in Assamese of Gauhati University will be covered in 4 (four) Semesters:
  - The 1st and the 3rd Semesters will be from January to June.
  - The 2nd and the 4th Semesters will be from July to December.
  - (b) Every Semester will have approximately 100 working days (after leaving out sundays, vacations and holidays) and 250 working hours (taking into account class cancellation and half holidays).
  - (c) Each course and internal assessment will get 60 academic hours at the minimum.
- 2. (a) The total marks for the programme will be 1600 of which 80% (= 1280) will be external and 20% (= 320) will be internal)
  - (b) Every Semester will have 5 'Course' (previoulsy call 'papers'). Each course will be of 80 marks. 80% (=64) of the total marks for the course will be external and 20% (=16) of the total marks for the course will be internal. This means, each question paper in an examination will be of 64 marks. The remaining 16 marks will be calculated internally. However, the internal assessment for each course will be related to the content of the course.
  - (c) All courses except 3-04, 3-05, 4-02, 4-03, 4-04 and 4-05 are common for all students. Courses 3-04, 3-05, 4-02, 4-03, 4-04 and 4-05 are optional. Students will have to study either 3-04A, 3-05A, 4-02A, 4-03A, 4-04A and 4-05A or 3-04B, 3-05B, 4-02B, 4-03B, 4-04B and 4-05B. Those who study the first group mentional above will be considered as having 'Specialization in Assamese Literature' (or 'Specialization in Group-A'). In the same way, the students who study the second group mentioned above will be considered as having 'Specialization in Assamese Language' (or 'Specialization in Gruop-B')
  - (d) Each course in the present syllabus indicates only the external marks (i.e, 64 marks, referred to as 'Full Marks' far as the external examination is concerned).
  - (e) Credit point for each course will be 8 (eight).
  - (f) The Internal Assessment marks for each course will be calculated as shown below.
