





Bikali College is the seat of higher learning in the easternmost border of Goalpara district. The College was established on 14th April, 1982. It is the outcome of selfless dedicated service of the rural masses of fifty two villages, which constitutes "Bikali Mouza Unnayan Samiti" –a socio- cultural Non- Governmental Organization.

1.1 NOMENCLATURE OF THE COLLEGE

The College is named after "Bikali Mouza" or "Dihi", which is part of the historical "Habraghat Pargana".

1 2 LOCATION

The College is located at Dhupdhara, a small market township of Bikali Mouza area. It is 0.75 km. away from N.H. 37 and Dhupdhara Railway Station. The College is under Rangjuli Tribal Development Block, Rangjuli revenue circle and 36- Dudhnoi ST Reserved L.A.C. (constitunancy) in Goalpara district of Assam.

1.3 COLLEGE CAMPUS

The College has a spacious campus. The campus extends and sprawls out in consonance with the rural environment. Most of the buildings have been modeled and constructed keeping a view the future landscape and also to harmonize well with the rural setting in the sylvan grandeur. At present the college built-up area is more than 2.5 hectares out of 7 hectares of total land area. Of these 4.5 hectares is covered by playground, plantation schemes and agricultural garden.

1.4 STREAM

The institution offers arts, commerce, science courses on the Higher Secondary Level, while Arts and Commerce with major course in almost all the subjects have been introduced in the Degree level. P.G. course in Assamese and Geography has been successfully introduced along with career oriented programmes.

1. 5 AFFILIATION AND DEFICIT

The College has been affiliated to Gauhati University since the 1988-89 session. The College was brought under Deficit -Grants -in Aid System in 1992 and presently under provincialised system of Govt. of Assam (2005). The college has been registered under UGC 12 (B) with effect from 10th plan.

1.6 NAAC RE-ACCREDITATION

The College has been re-accredited (Third-cycle) by NAAC in 2016-17 and was awarded "B" grade.

1.7 IQAC

For the process of monitoring the development of the College, an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established under the guideline of NAAC. The cell has its Website and Internet for academic audit and linkage with NAAC and other agencies. Moreover the website is updated at regular interval.

1.8 OTHER AIDS

The "Bikali Mouza Unnayan Samiti" - a socio-cultural organization is the major contributor to the College in every aspects of development. Besides, "Tin Daliya Raiz", Dhupdhara, Rabha Hasong Autonomous Council, Gaon Panchayats and a large number of individual benevolent donors have contributed for its development. The Integrated Tribal Development Project has also contributed by granting scholarship to tribal students.





1. The B.A. Degree Course for Arts and Commerce will be imparted as per Gauhati University Regulation of Semester System.

THE SCHEDULE FOR THE SEMESTER SYSTEM (ARTS & COMMERCE) ARE GIVEN BELOW:

1ST, 3RD & 5TH SEMESTER, (INCLUDING EXAMINATION)	FROM AUGUST 1ST TO DECEMBER 31, 2017.
2ND, 4TH & 6TH SEMESTER (INCLUDING EXAMINATION)	FROM JANUARY 1ST TO JUNE 30, 2017.

2. EVALUATION PROCESS:

(a) Internal Evaluation: 20 Marks (b) External Evaluation: 80 Marks

Internal Evaluation will be based on two sessional examinations –

(i) Home assignments

(ii) Seminars

(iii) Library works, etc.

External Evaluation will be through a final examination at the end of the semester.

- △The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%.
- △ In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the Internal as well as External Evaluations separately.
- △ A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
- (a) First Semester with the regular third Semester examination.
- (b) Second Semester with the regular fourth semester examination.
- (c) Third Semester with the regular fifth Semester examination.

- (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester examination.
- A student may be allowed to 'Repeat' any one of the theory papers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester and may be allowed for 'betterment' of marks in one paper in the fifth Semester, provided the student secure less than 45% marks in that particular paper.
- ® No 'Repeat' or 'Betterment' shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any Semester.
- PA student must pass all his Semester examination, including 'Repeat' and 'Betterment' chances within five years from the date of admission to the first semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.
- P Since the Semester involves continuous assessment there will be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.

THE PROCESSES INVOLVED IN THE NEW SEMESTER SYSTEM IS SUBJECT TO MODIFICATION AS PER DIRECTION OF THE GAUHATI UNIVERSITY.

The Students of Semester system are asked to note the following and pursue them positively:

- They must carry out at least 75 percent class attendance.
- They must appear in all sessional examinations conducted in the college time to time.
- They must perform the assignments given by the concerned departments.
- They must participate in group discussion, presentation of seminar, symposia etc. organised by the concerned departments.
- They must maintain close contact with their departments (both General & major Courses)
- Pailing to pursue the above, students will not be allowed to appear in the respective Final Examination.
